

Crab facts

Crabs are crustaceans and have an exoskeleton (thick shell) which is like a shield on its body.



Crabs are invertebrates (animals without a backbone). Their exoskeleton protects them from predators and provides support for their bodies.

Crabs actually have ten legs. The first pair of legs are modified into claws.

The largest crab is the Japanese Spider Crab which has a leg span up to 3.8 m and can weigh up to 19 kg.

Most crabs live in water but some live entirely on land.

After losing its claw, a crab can grow it back.

What other interesting facts can you find about crabs?
