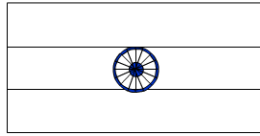

Start your questions with words such as why, when, were or what.

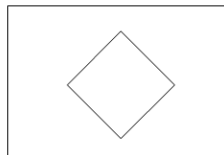
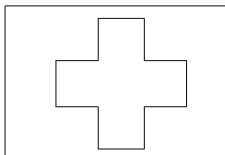
Remember to end each question with a question mark. (?)

Give the quiz to your friends and family. Were they able to answer the questions?

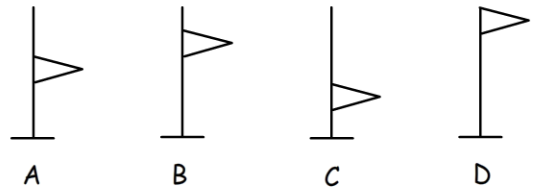
### Flags of international organizations

#### Semaphore Flag Signaling.
