

Dragonfly facts

A dragonfly is an insect.

They have an elongated body with two sets of transparent wings, three pairs of legs and very large eyes.



Some dragonflies can fly over 50 km/h. They can fly like a helicopter, moving in all directions, forward, backward, up and down, as well as hovering.

Dragonfly eyes contain up to 30,000 individual lenses. Human eyes only have one lens.

There are fossilized records of dragonflies that are over 300 million years old.

Dragonflies feed on insects like mosquitoes, gnats, midges and ants.

Adult dragonflies live near water such as streams, lakes and ponds.

Lifecycle of a dragonfly

Dragonflies have three stages in their life cycle: egg - larva (nymph) - adult.


The larvae live in streams, lakes and ponds among plants and rocks. Most of their life is spent in the larval nymph stage underneath the water surface.

 wings (forewings and hindwings), abdomen, head, thorax and legs.



Plurals

If a dragonfly lived for 5 years.


How many months is that?
