

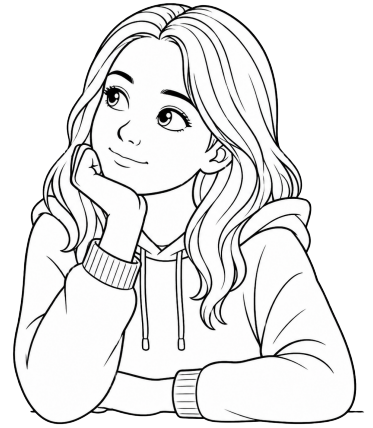
# Compound Adjectives

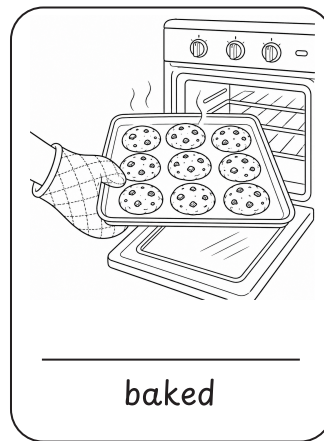
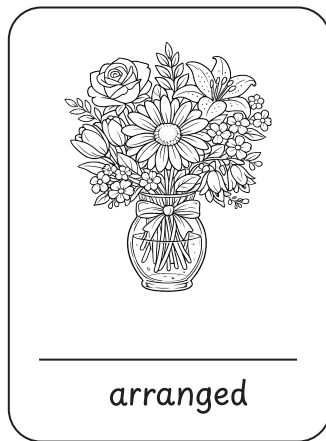
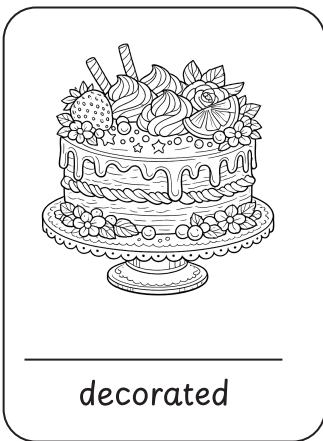
Adverbs ending in **-ly** are **NOT** hyphenated when they combine with a past participle (verb form ending in **-ed**).  
Example: a recently planted tree
