Cows can climb up stairs, but cannot climb down stairs because their knees cannot bend properly.

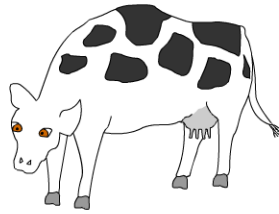
A cow's stomach has four parts.

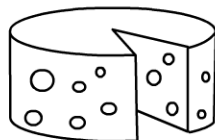

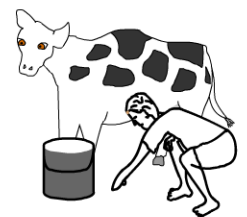
