Joseph Mallord William Turner

**Born**: 23 April 1775

Died: 19 December 1851

Style: Romanticism

Turner was an English artist who specialized in landscapes. He is known for his highly atmospheric style which captured the mood of the scenes he painted in oil paints and watercolors.

Turner painted shipwrecks, fires, stormy seas, fog and sunlight and was fascinated with displaying the awe-inspiring grandeur and power of nature. Light was a key feature of his paintings.

Today, two prestigious art prizes are named after him.



#### The Battle Of Trafalgar

In 1822, King George IV of England commissioned Turner to paint a commemorative account of the victory of Lord Nelson's Fleet in the Battle of Trafalgar.

Turner not only captured the fierceness of the battle but highlighted sacrifice of war. (Lord Nelson himself and many others died in this victory in 1805.)

The Temeraire was a fighting ship that was involved in the Battle of Trafalgar.

She looks like a ghost as the sun sets on her valiant career. Turner has given her a beautiful send off in this painting.



#### Sun Setting over a Lake

Turner has concentrated on the atmospheric lighting of a sunset over water in this painting. Apart from the setting sun on the horizon, nothing else is clearly visible in the haze.

Turner was a master painter who was known as "The Painter of Light." It is not hard to see why!
