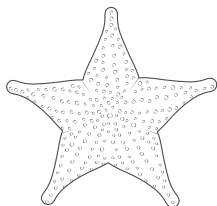
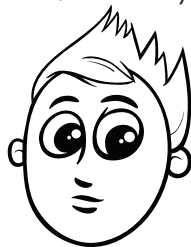
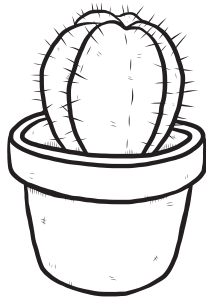
Spiky Self Portrait
