Matisse was a French painter who was best known for his brightly colored paintings. His early work was labeled "fauve" (wild beast) due to his use of wild colors and line. He continually experimented with new styles and was a leading figure in the Modern Art Movement, along with his life-long friend Pablo Picasso.

Matisse is also known for his sculptures and brightly colored paper collage techniques.



The Red Room: Harmony in Red


