# Halloween Safety

**SUPERVISION:** Never trick-or treat alone!

Children should always be accompanied by an adult.

**PEDESTRIAN SAFETY:** Remember the road rules and stay on the footpath.

Be aware of cars, cross roads safely and walk, don't run.

**SAFE HOUSES:** Never go inside a house unless you are with an adult you trust (like your parents).

Only visit well-lit houses. Don't stop at dark houses (it usually means they don't want to be disturbed).

**WAIT:** Only eat your treats after an adult you trust (like your parents) have looked at them.
