Foxes eat insects, small reptiles, birds and their eggs.

Rabbits eat grass, flowers, weeds, twigs and bark.

Gorillas mainly eat fruit, leaves, seeds and stems but also eat termites, caterpillars, ants, snails and grubs.

Gorilla

omnivore

Red squirrels eat seeds of trees, fungi, nuts, young shoots and sometimes bird's eggs.

Horses eat grasses roots and shrubs.

herbivore

Grizzly bears eat large mammals, fish birds and their eggs, pine nuts, tubers, berries and grasses.

Zebras eat grasses, bark, roots, leaves and stems.

Zebra

herbivore

Hyenas hunt prey that is often larger than themselves. They also scavenge carrion from other animals' hunts.

Hyena

carnivore

Kangaroos eat grasses and small plants.

Wolves generally eat large prey such as deer and moose but will eat small prey and insects when necessary.

Wolf

carnivore

Lions hunt large prey such as zebras, giraffes, antelope, wildebeests and buffalo.

Sheep eat grass, weeds and pasture plants.

Sheep

herbivore

Raccoons eat insects, worms, birds eggs, fish, amphibians and plant material, fruits and nuts.

Chimpanzees eat leaves, flowers, stems and bark insects, birds, eggs and small-medium sized mammals.

Giraffes eat leaves and buds of trees and shrubs.
