Suffix Origins 'ive'

Adjectives that end in 'ive' have the meaning 'pertaining to', 'tending to'. This suffix comes from the Latin '-ivus'.

The suffix 'ive' can be added to a base word to form an adjective that means 'having to do with' that thing or action. (The base word can be a noun or a verb) Sometimes the final letters of the base word are changed or deleted before adding 'ive'
