Someone can appear kind and trustworthy, but underneath the charm is a person who is up to no good.

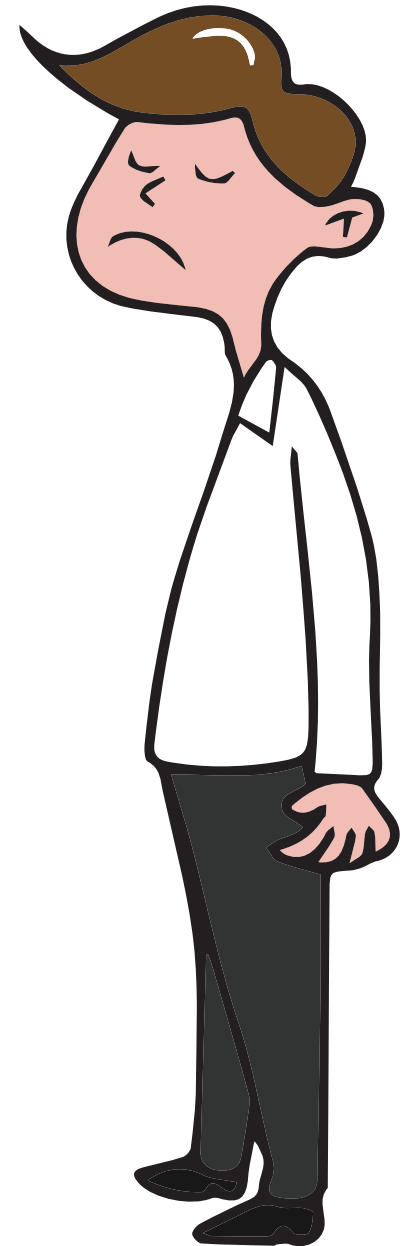
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On the other hand...
