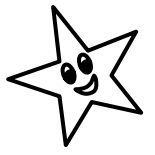




# Retain silent "e" when adding "ly"



Adding the suffix "ly" to a base word can turn it into an adverb. These words typically describe how, in what way, when, where, or to what extent an action is done.

When the base word ends in a silent "e", retain the "e" before adding "ly".

example:

accurate + ly = accurately

She answered the question accurately.
