Frogs and toads belong to the same animal group, but there are several differences.

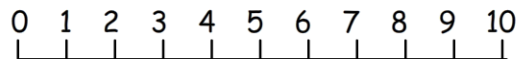
For example, frogs need to live near water, but toads do not need to live near water to survive.

Prepare a short report about the differences between frogs and toads.

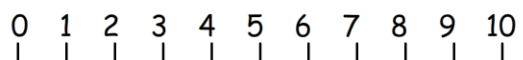

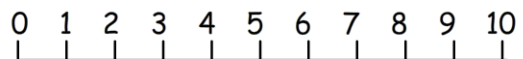
If Freddie the frog jumps 2 cm each leap, how far will he go in 4 jumps?
