Yellow fruits

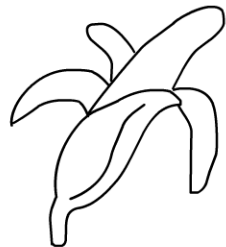
Bananas are one of several yellow fruits.

Do you like eating bananas?

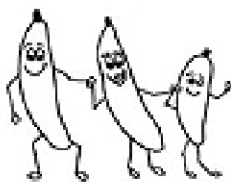
What is your favourite way to eat bananas?
